

Artists corner



An award-winning songwriter who helped found the Youth

Movement Soul Survivor in the 1990's, Matt Redman has written many popular worship songs including "The Heart of Worship", and "I Will Offer Up My Life" and "10,000 Reasons" in collaboration with Jonas Myrin.

Although some songs take months to write, this one came to him in the early hours of a morning in 2012, after a long day composing in a chapel in the small village where he lives. "I wanted to go home, but he recalls Jonas saying, 'I've got this one other little thing, a tiny bit of melody that I think could be something special' and "immediately a song started pouring out of us."

The album's producer insisted on including it on the track-list, despite Mr Redman's reservations of it sounding 'unfinished' and it went on to win not one, but two Grammy Awards. However, it was the email he received the following morning that he cherished more. In it, a woman described how her uncle had found faith shortly before his death, he requested that the song be played in his final moments. Matt Redman felt it as "God's kindness to re-orientate me and say 'last night was cool, but this is the reason you write songs."

Amongst Matt Redman's favourite hymn writers namely Horatio Spafford who wrote "It Is Well with My Soul" reportedly written at sea as he made the same journey that had resulted in the drowning of his four daughters.

"How did you find your way to a place of praise? How did you not just shut down?"

Pointing to the high proportion of laments in the Book of Psalms, Mr Redman spoke of the importance of songs that address pain. "There is no-one who escapes pain, heartache, confusion, stress. It's not just relevant to people in church. If you sing honest songs that are raw and real, they will be relevant to people's lives outside the churchwhen you start to sing about troubles, you very quickly start to journey into the compassionate, kind, generous, caring heart of God. It is the songs that He has written on these themes, that have generated "the most beautiful stories."

Mr Redman's father took his own life when Matt was seven. Shortly afterwards, a group from a Vineyard church in the U.S visited his church St. Andrew's in Chorleywood and he was "fascinated" by the music they brought with them but also a sense that "people were really talking not just about God, but to God, and it felt active and real. I was seeing the people of God in the presence of God, pouring out praise to God"

During quite a "turbulent childhood," learning to sing the songs and play them on the guitar "kept me stable" he said. Matt began writing songs as a way of praying, and discovered that "if you get it right you can write in such a way that people attach their stories, to the song,


there is no formula to repeat, anything that is meaningful, spiritual, powerful, that is not me, that is the hand of God.




Our Rejuvenation Project Update

On 4 April, our Faculty application for the planned building reordering of St Mary's Church was submitted to the DAC with a date of 27 April set for our application to be reviewed by the full Committee. Following submission I received, via the DAC, a number of preliminary questions, which is a normal part of the Faculty process. These questions were in the main asking for clarification of technical aspects. I also received comments and queries from the Victorian Society regarding our Statement of Significance focusing on obtaining more in depth technical, historical, and architectural data. I forwarded these initial questions to Mayway including the request by the Victorian Society. Mayway is currently dealing with these and has commissioned a full Historical Report to be produced for consideration by the DAC Mayway's technical expert visited the Church on 24 April to take a set of specific photographs, both inside and outside the building to support the written report.

All did seem to be on track but like all our lives, Covid-19 has had an impact and on 10 April I received an email from the DAC Secretary stating that the DAC office is now closed until the lockdown regulations have been eased. Therefore there will be no DAC meeting on 27 April or for the foreseeable future and currently our Faculty application is on hold. However the work to complete all the questions and queries raised together with the production of the Historical Report still goes on, so that when we have the 'green light' we can proceed immediately.

Please therefore could I ask for your continued prayers as we journey together to build a beacon for Jesus in Alvaston through our whole Church rejuvenation project.



Update from the Foodbank team.

The Food Forum Network in partnership with Derby County and the Derby Covid Community Response Hub have set up public donation points for food donations to be dropped at the Fan Zone in the car park at Pride Park Stadium starting this week. Donations can be dropped off every Monday & Thursday between 10am-2pm as part of your food shop or work journeys to ensure we meet government guidance on only journeying when needed. This food will help towards supporting individuals & families who are most in need and vulnerable due to impact of Covid 19.

Items required are ambient tinned or packet food. Thank you.

All Christians Together South East Derby (ACT) are very busy working with Derby Covid Community Response Hub (DCCRH), and the Derby Food Forum Network. The Food bank continues. This week we supported 12 families in need and last week provided 16 emergency food bags for people unable to shop for themselves (because of the current crisis. That equates to in excess of 150 person days of food. Thank you to all those still providing food donations to your local food bank collection points, those bringing them to Alvaston Parish Church on a Tuesday (from 10 to 12). The ward Coordinators, those taking food to and from the central distribution hub, and the volunteers delivering to homes.

Love compels us to fight against coronavirus alongside our sisters and brothers living in poverty.


Love compels us to stand together in prayer with our neighbours near and far.
